Family Background

- 22.8% Percent of parents who reported that their household includes only 1 adult
- 13.7% Percent of parents reporting that their household includes 4 or more children
- 12.4% Percent of parents who reported that they did not complete high school
- 37.3 Percent of parents who completed a 2-year college degree or higher degree
- 5.0% Percent of parents who reported that a sibling of the child taking the ESSP dropped out of high school

School Services Received by Students

- 11.5% Percent of students who were eligible to receive services for children with learning disabilities
- 0.9% Percent of students who were eligible to receive services for children with behavioral/emotional problems
- 3.9% Percent of students who were eligible to receive services for children with other health impairments (OHI), such as attention disorders
- 19.6% Percent of students who were eligible for gifted or talented program services
- 30.2% Percent of students who receive after-school care at the school
- 10.5% Percent of students who take part in after-school activities, such as team sports, band, or clubs, according to their parents

School Communications with Parents

- 5.8% Percent of students whose parents had received a warning in the past 30 days from school staff about the child's attendance
- 30.7% Percent of students whose parents had received a warning in the past 30 days from school staff about the child's grades or academic performance
- 26.5% Percent of students whose parents had received a warning in the past 30 days from school staff about the child's behavior at school
- 84.1% Percent of parents agreed or strongly agreed with the statement, "My child's teacher cares about my child."
- 97.1% Percent of parents who agreed or strongly agreed with the statement, "My child's teacher wants my child to do well in school."
- 94.5% Percent of parents who agreed or strongly agreed that someone at the school would contact them if they had concerns about the child's behavior or progress at school
- 30.8% Percent of parents who reported that it is often hard for them to be involved at the school because of their work schedule

School Climate and Experiences

- 15.3% Percent of students who reported that they often or always get picked on at school
- 9.6% Percent of parents who said they always or often are afraid someone will hurt or bother their child at school

Parental Monitoring of Child

- 86.3% Percent of parents who reported that they know most or almost all of their children's friends
- 64.1% Percent of parents who reported that they know the parents of most or almost all of their children's friends

Child Activities

- 76.7% Percent of parents who reported that their children spend at least 30 minutes per school night on homework
- 22.5% Percent of students who spend 2 or more hours per school night watching TV, according to their parents
- 2.3% Percent of students who play non-educational computer or video games for 2 or more hours per school night, according to their parents
- 75.4% Percent of students who spend 1 or more hours per school night using a computer for homework or learning purposes

- 47.9% Percent of students who spend no time on adult-supervised neighborhood or community activities
- 76.7% Percent of students who spend 2 or more hours per week on adult-supervised neighborhood or community activities
- 22.5% Percent of students who spend 1 or more hours per week on home chores

Community Safety

- 13.4% Percent of students who often or always get picked on while on their way to or from school
- 7.5% Percent of students who often or always get picked on when they play outside in their neighborhood
- 9.1% Percent of parents who reported that drugs are somewhat of a problem or a big problem in their neighborhood
- 12.1% Percent of parents who reported that people move in and out of their neighborhood a lot
- 21.0% Percent of parents who reported that they have moved one or more times in the past year
- 2.0% A small percentage of parents reported that a child had been removed from a home in the neighborhood because of abuse or neglect

Family Educational Orientation

- 73.1% Percent of students who said they want to go to college after high school
- 95.0% Percent of students who reported that the adults in their home often or always tell them to do their best in school
- 72.1% Percent of parents who reported that they expect their children to complete a 4-year college program or more
- 42.5% Percent of teachers who reported that parents of students taking the ESSP are highly involved in their children's education at home
- 59.6% Percent of teachers who reported that parents of students taking the ESSP have high educational expectations for their children
- 93.3% Percent of parents who think their child is getting a good or excellent education at your school
- 52.4% Percent of parents who believe parents like themselves can have a lot of influence in making schools better places for students to learn and develop

Family Health Expectations and Behavior

- 33.0% Percent of parents who thought it was somewhat likely or very likely that their children will drink alcohol when they get older
- 13.6% Percent of parents who thought it was somewhat likely or very likely that their children will smoke cigarettes when they get older
- 7.0% Percent of parents who thought it was somewhat likely or very likely that their children will smoke marijuana when they get older
- 3.6% Percent of parents who thought it was somewhat likely or very likely that their children will use other illegal drugs when they get older
- 86.4% Percent of parents who said they have talked about drugs, cigarettes, or alcohol more than once or that they talk about these things often

Psychological Well-Being of Students

- 50.0% Percent of students who reported that they often or always keep their worries to themselves when they are scared or worried
- 22.1% Percent of students who have experienced the death of a close family member in the past year
- 2.4% Percent of students for whom a doctor has recommended medication for anxiety or depression during the current year, according to their parents
- 6.3% Percent of students for whom a doctor has recommended medication for an attention disorder during the current year, according to their parents

Physical Well-Being of Students

- 15.4% Percent of students for whom a doctor has recommended medication for a physical or medical disorder during the current year, according to their parents
- 3.2% Percent of students who report they have a toothache most days
- 4.6% Percent of students who report trouble seeing the blackboard or words in books
- 1.8% Percent of students reporting they have trouble hearing the teacher most days

Academic Performance of Students

- 15.9% Percent of students taking the ESSP who have repeated one or more grades
- 12.2% Percent of students who received a D or F in reading on their last report card
- 11.3% Percent of students who received a D or F in math on their last report card
- 8.7% Percent of students teachers believe are only capable of below grade level work in reading/language
- 15.9% Percent of students teachers believe are only capable of below grade level work in math
